Collisions

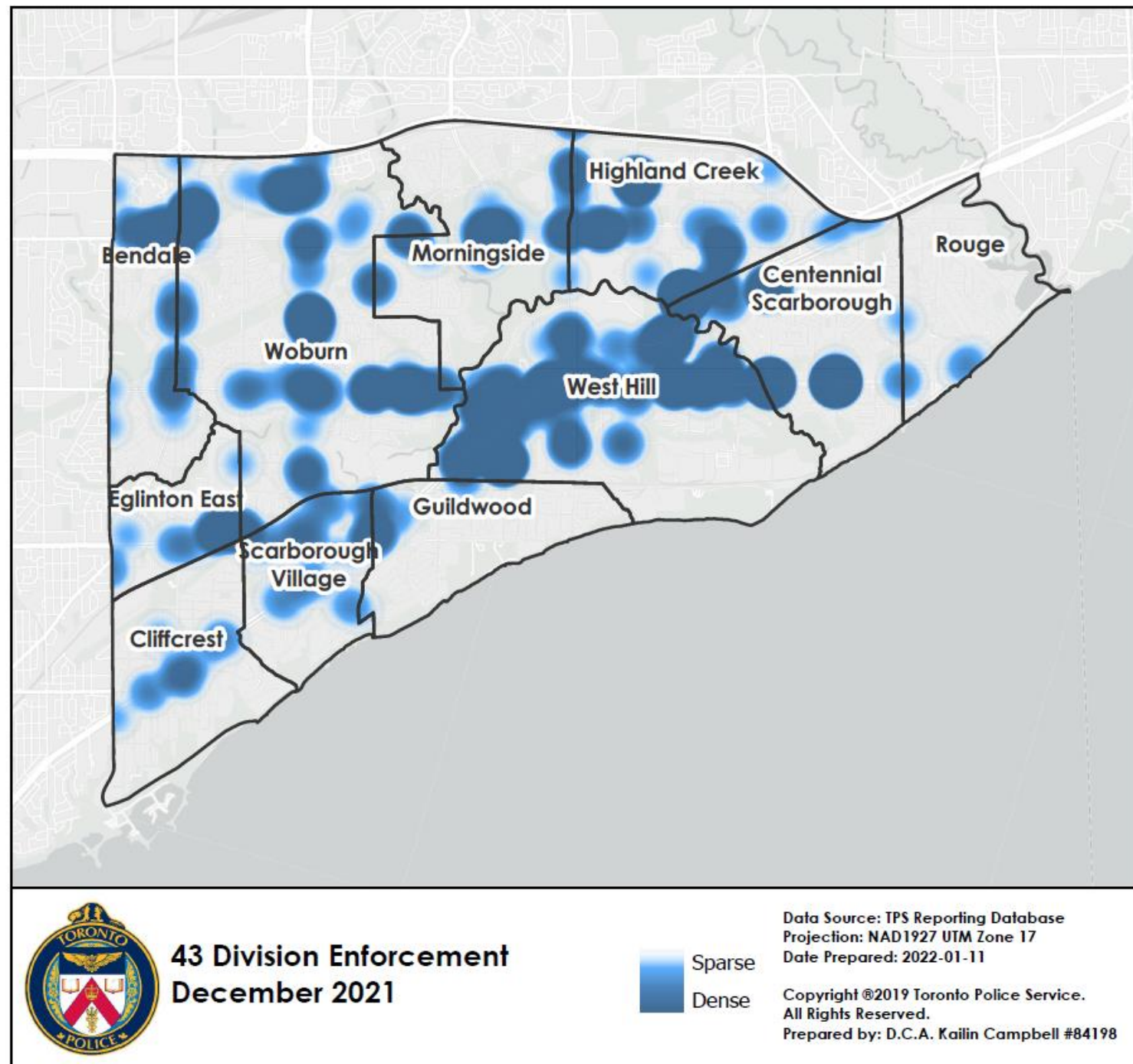
- There were 261 motor vehicle collisions during the month of December. This monthly collision total is approximately 7% lower than the November total.
- Notable hotspots include; the area of Kingston Rd/Lawrence Ave E, Lawrence Ave E in the areas of Markham Rd and Brimley Rd, Markham Rd/Ellesmere Rd, Eglinton Ave E., and the area of the Scarborough Town Centre. These hotspots align with the 2021 full year hotspots.
- The majority of events occurred between 10:00 and 19:00.
- We encourage drivers to exercise caution when driving in inclement winter weather.

YTD by Month



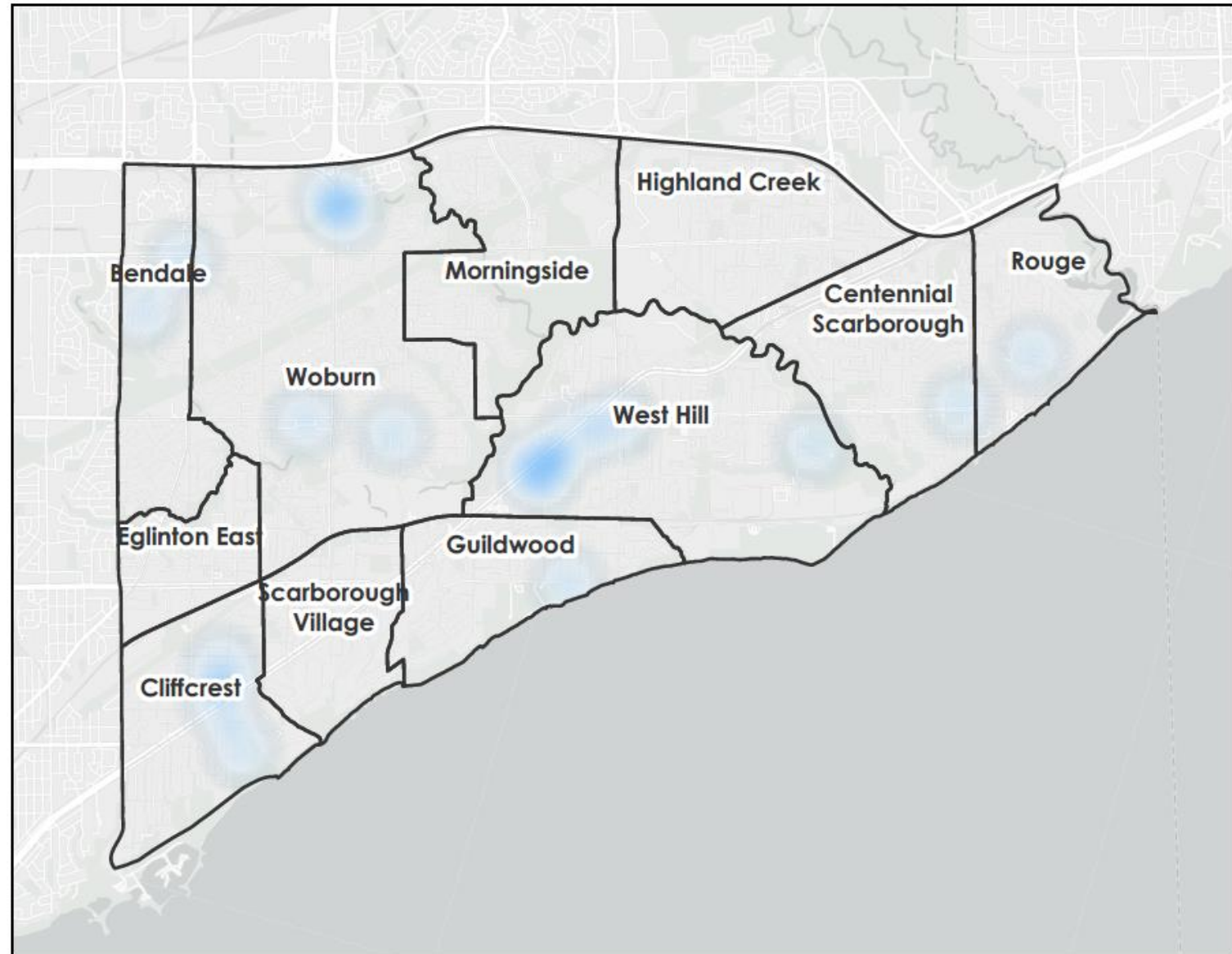
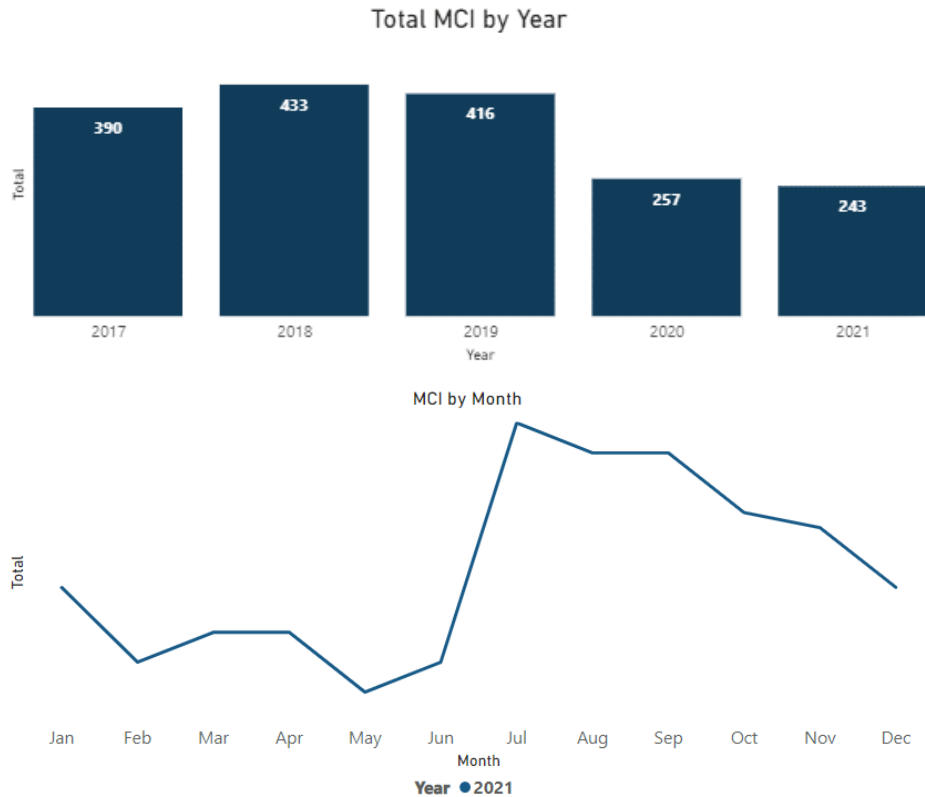
Enforcement

- Notable enforcement along Lawrence Ave E, Markham Rd, and Kingston Rd.
- The majority of tickets were issued during the morning and afternoon rush hours (09:00-11:00 / 13:00-15:00).
- Speeding tickets account for 29% of all tickets issued, and Aggressive Driving tickets account for 20% of all tickets issued.
- We continue to encourage drivers to operate their vehicles with caution and be mindful of speed.



Break & Enters

- Notable hotspots in the area of Kingston Rd in West Hill, and the area of Markham Rd and Progress Ave (Woburn).
- There was 5.4% decrease in break and enters between 2020 and 2021.
- There was a notable surge in occurrences in July, which gradually tapered off throughout the remainder of the year. This surge was primarily due to an increase in commercial entries.



43 Division Break & Enter December 2021

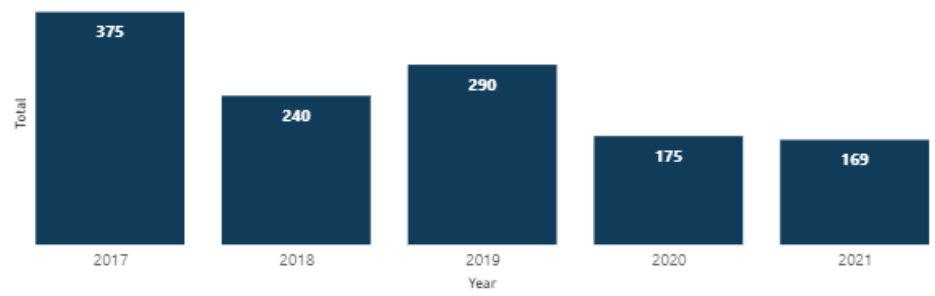

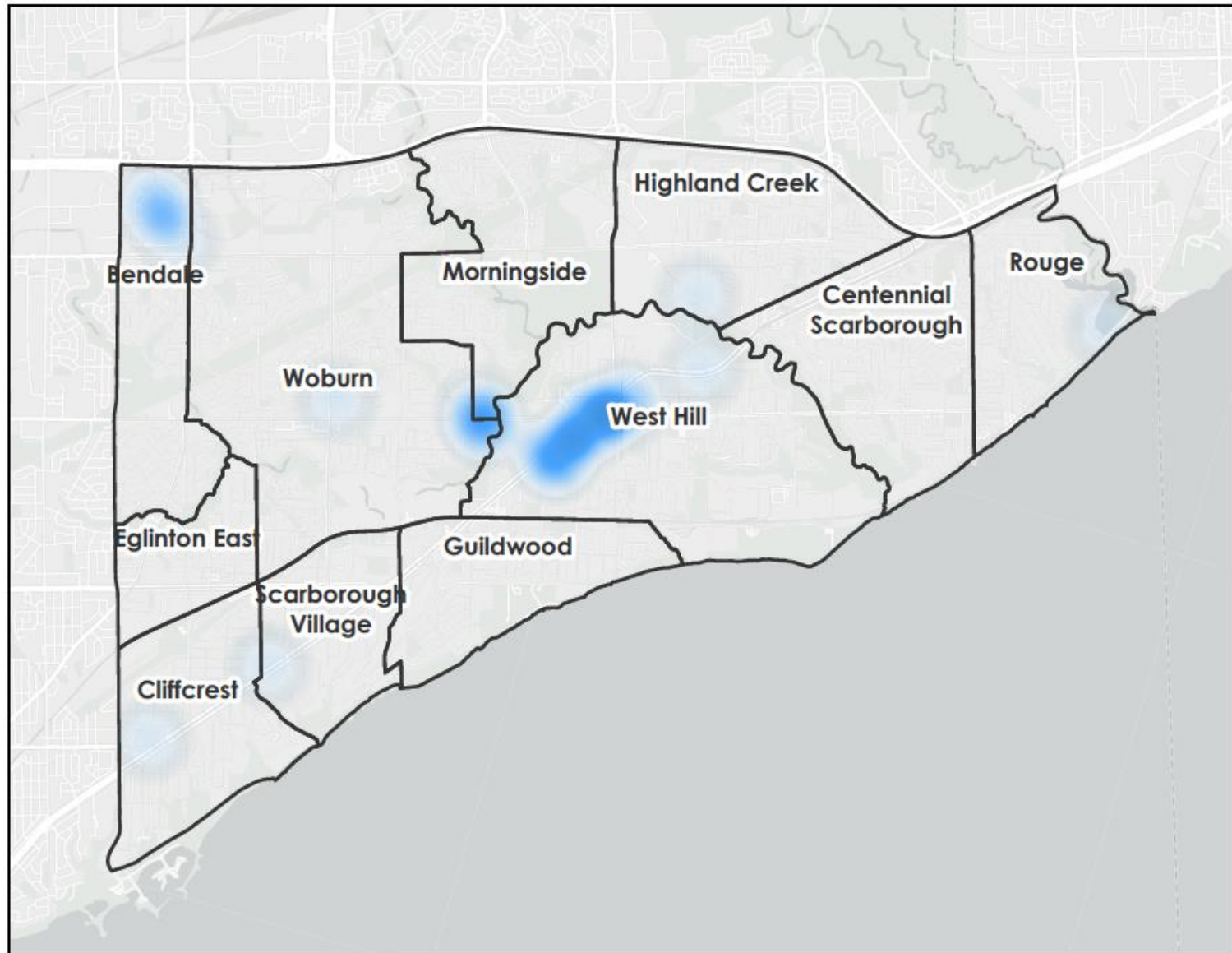
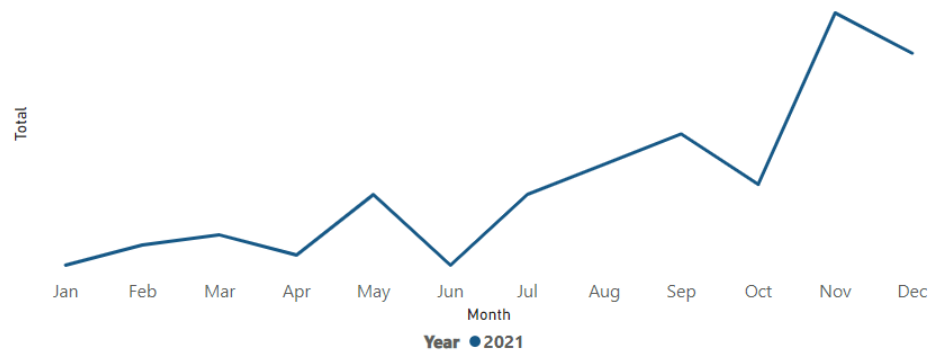
Robberies

- There was a notable increase in robberies during November, which persisted into December.
- There are notable hotspots in the area of Kingston Rd and Lawrence Ave E (West Hill), the area of Lawrence Ave E and Orton Park (Woburn/Morningside), and the Scarborough Town Centre (Bendale).
- Overall, there was 3.4% decrease in robberies between 2020 and 2021.

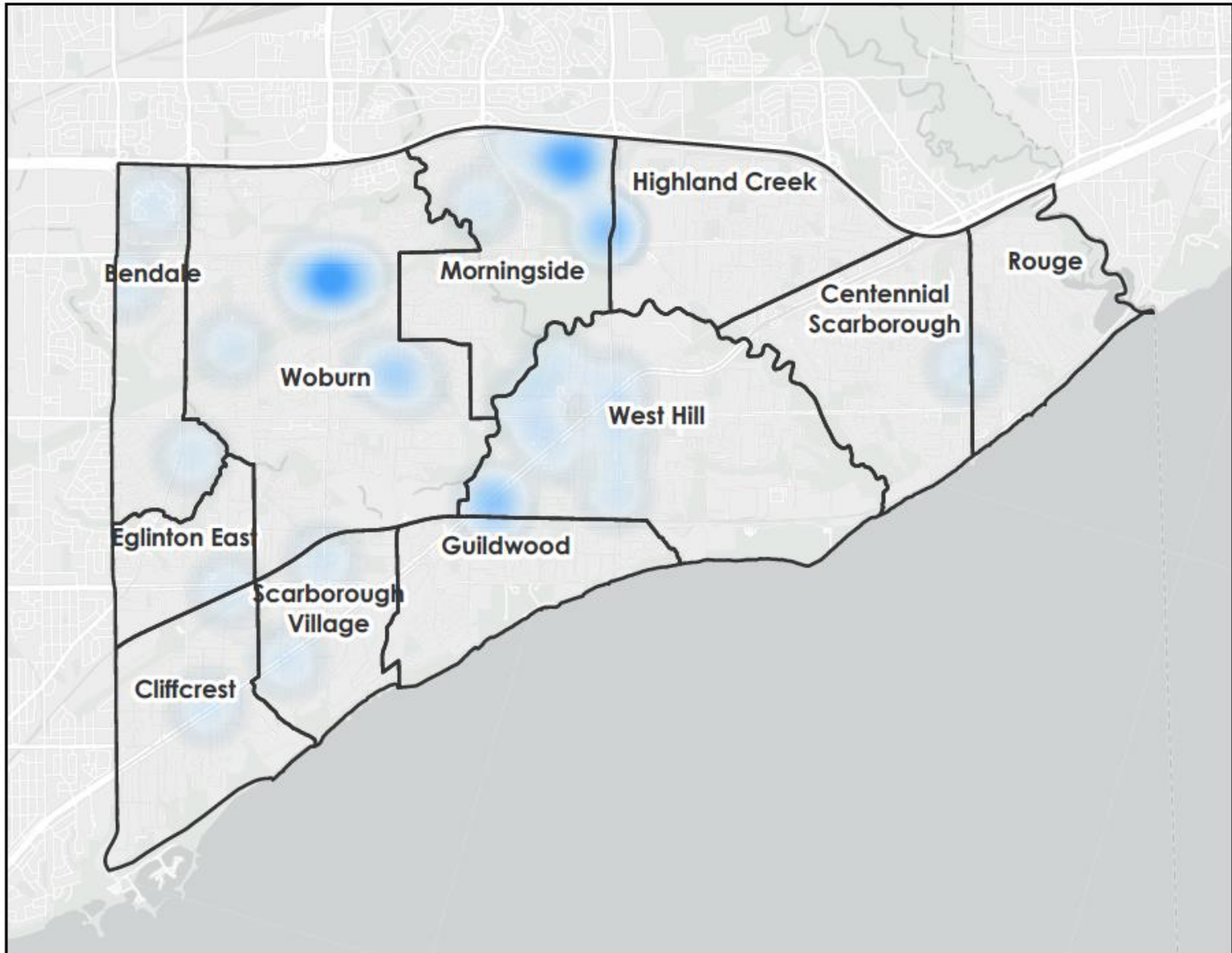
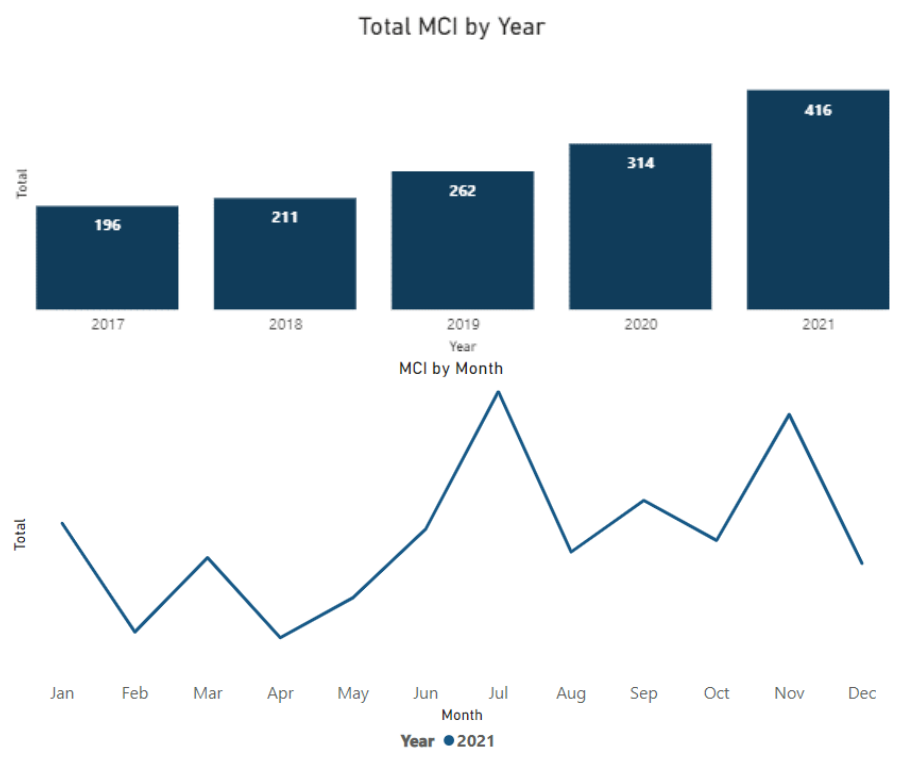

Auto Theft

- Following a surge in November, there was a decrease in auto thefts throughout December.
- There are notable hotspots in Woburn and Morningside.
- Hondas continue to be stolen most frequently, accounting for 36% of the monthly total. Newer model Honda Cr-V's and Civics were the primary models targeted.
- There was 32.5% increase in robberies between 2020 and 2021.
- 30% of all 2021 vehicle thefts were Hondas.



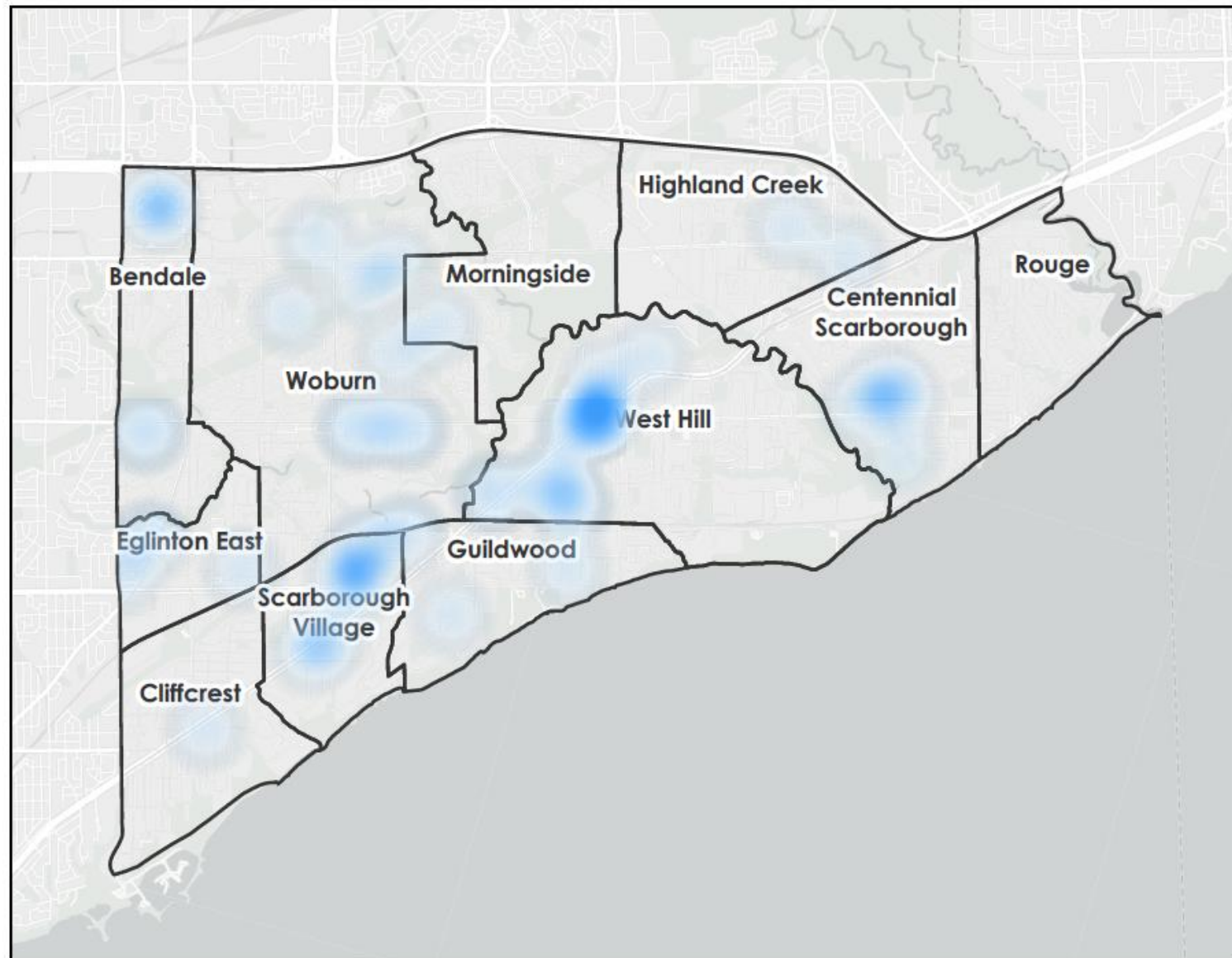
43 Division Auto Theft December 2021

Theft from Motor Vehicle

- Vehicles continue to be targeted in driveways, residential parking lots, and commercial parking lots.
- Wallets and loose change were targeted most frequently, however there were several occurrences where hand tools, clothing, and sunglasses were stolen.
- Notable hotspots include; the area of Kingston Rd/Lawrence Ave E (West Hill), and the area of Eglinton Ave E/Markham Rd (Scarborough Village).
- 26% of occurrences were theft of license plates. These thefts occurred sporadically throughout the division.
- 68% of vehicle entries did not result in vehicle damage, indicating that vehicles may have been left unlocked.
- Remember to lock your vehicle doors, keep windows rolled up, and remove valuables.

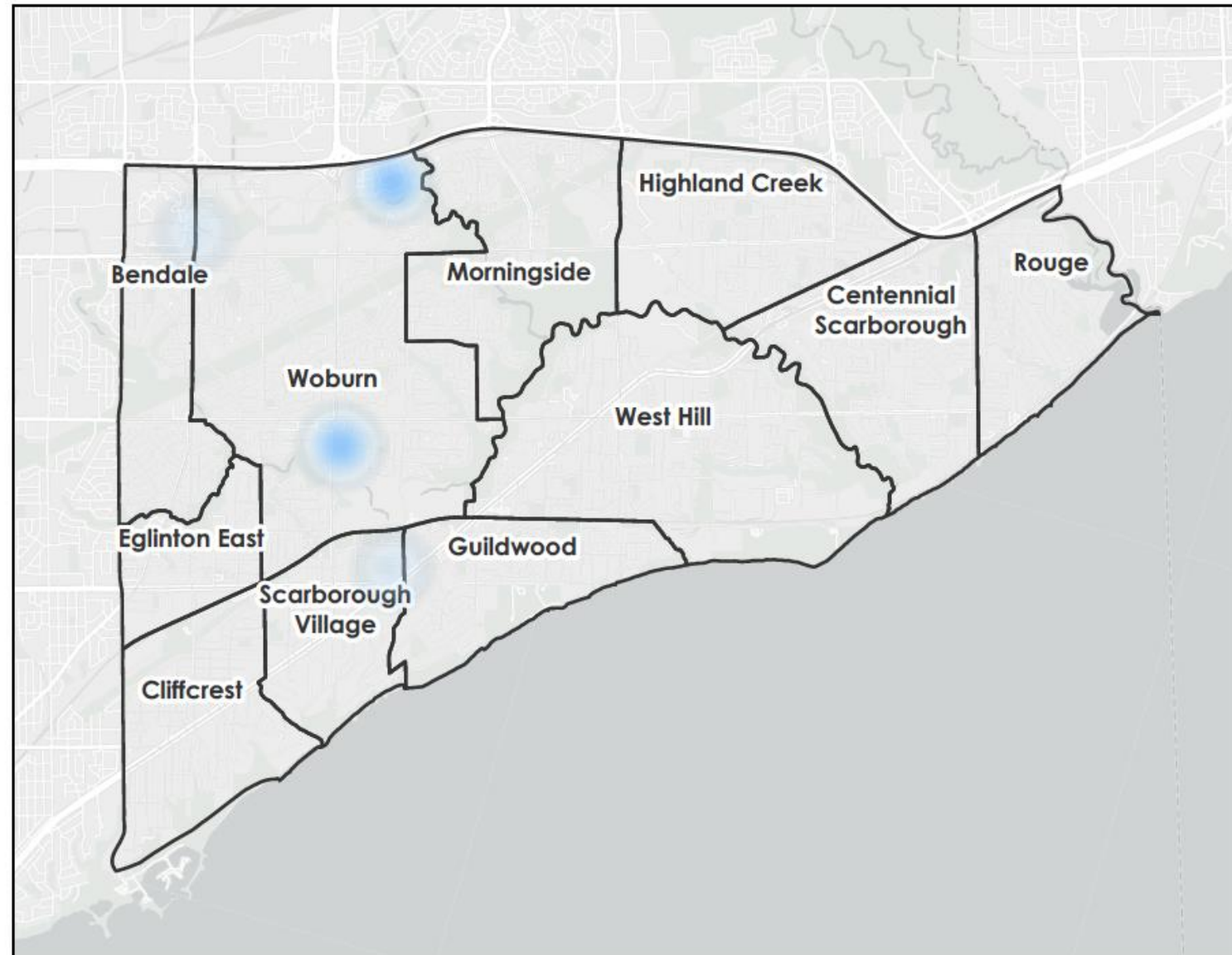
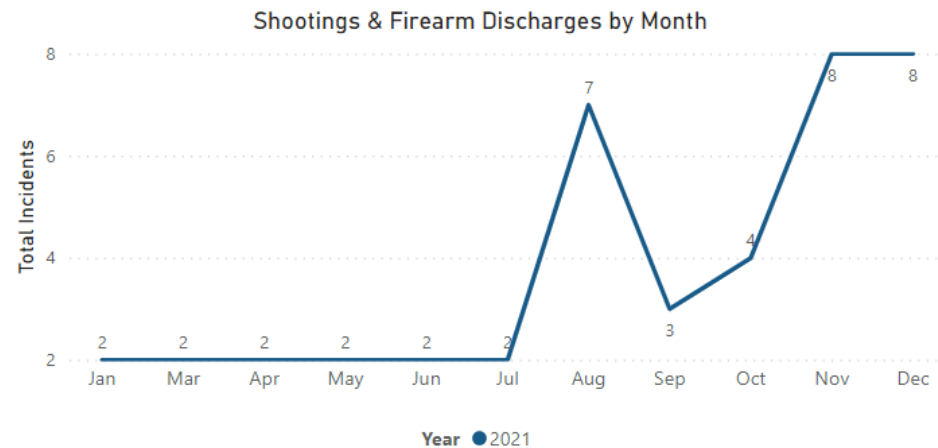
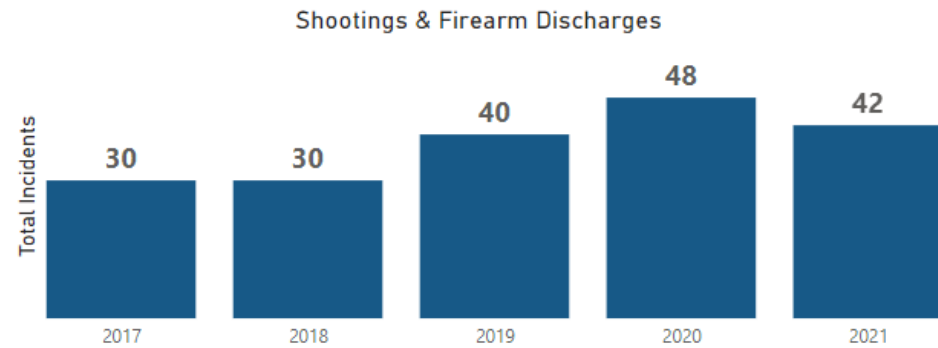

Firearm Discharges

- 42 firearm discharge occurrences throughout 2021, which is a 12.5% decrease from the 2020 total.
- There was a notable surge in occurrences throughout the month of November, which continued through December.
- 8 occurrences in the month of December.
 - 3 injuries, and 4 firearms related arrests.
 - Two notable hotspots in Woburn.

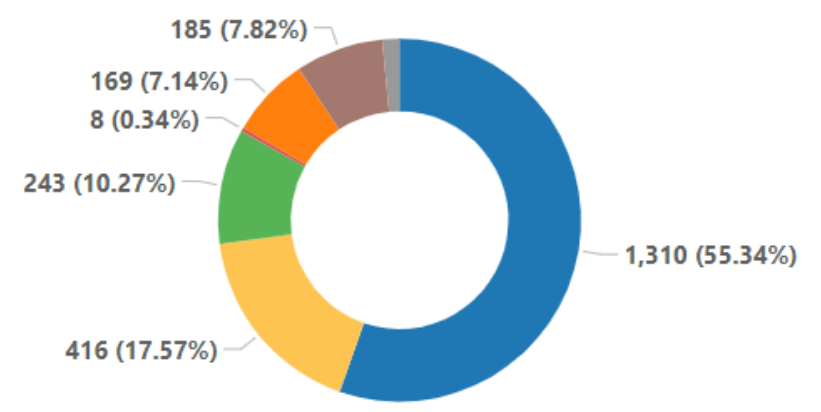
